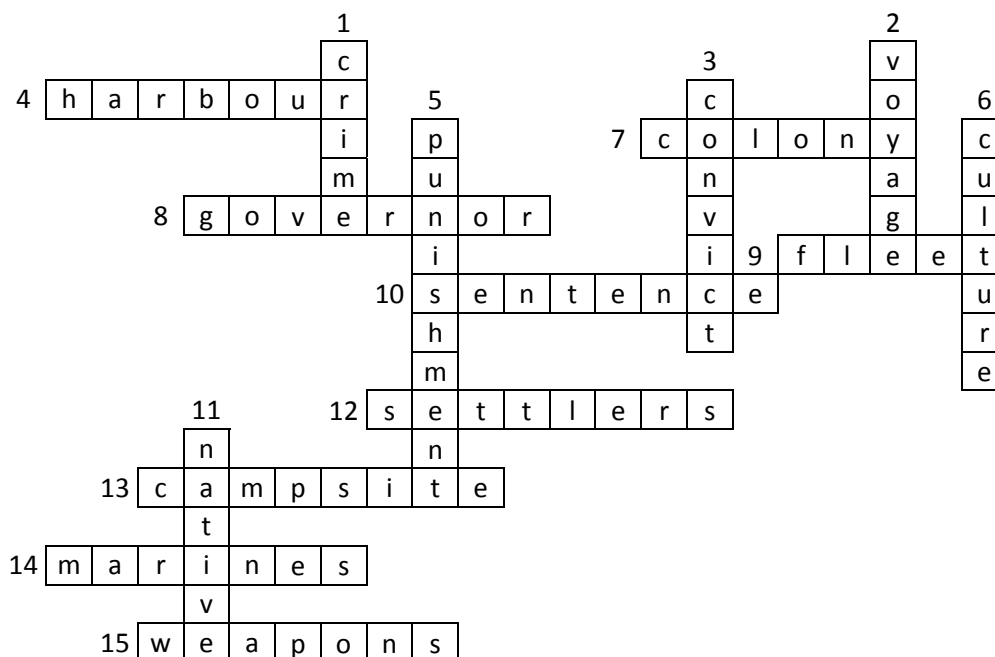
First Fleet summary

The 'First Fleet' is the name given to the 11 ships that left England in May 1787 with over seven hundred convicts to establish a settlement in New South Wales. The First Fleet arrived in Sydney Cove in January 1788; the convicts and their overseers established of the first European colony in Australia.

Teaching suggestions

- Before distributing the crossword for students to complete individually, ask them to work in groups to brainstorm any words they know relating to the First Fleet.
